Feb 20th Block Watch Meeting

Thanks to the folks who joined us for the Commercial Block Watch meeting yesterday evening and to Marguerite for hosting at beautiful John L. Scott. I wanted to highlight 10 topics:

- 1. Noticing more disorder in the Junction, new faces we haven't seen
- 2. If you decide to take a photo or shoot video, please be aware of your personal safety
- 3. Emailing the Junction to email out and post on SLACK remains the preferred choice of communication
- 4. If someone <u>is acting suspicious</u>, jot down their characteristics including scars, tattoos, clothing, height etc. and *shoes* (people can remove or add clothing)
- If a crime is committed but the person has left, still call 911 to report or complete an online incident report – <u>here's the link</u>
- 6. If you feel unsafe, when you call 911 tell the dispatcher you feel unsafe or the person is in crisis this escalates the call
- 7. Entering a commercial building without permission is considered a gross misdemeanor
- 8. If someone is acting strangely, you can tell them they are no longer permitted on the premises
- 9. If you want to <u>no trespass</u> a person, a police officer has the paperwork
- 10. If you don't want to confront a person, you can hand them a piece of paper asking them to leave

Jennifer and I are working on a flyer you can post at your business for employees. Once we've finalized the flyer I'll sent that out to everyone for you to print and post.
